It is lethargic and appears to be fading away, and its abdomen is very hard to touch. What are next steps at this point? He has called and left a message for Dr. Peregrine at Guelph U. He is no longer associated with West Main Animal Clinic and Dr. Sheri Davidson is at a clinic that will not permit exotics. He has no veterinarian at this time. I offered to contact Dr. Peregrine. I also advised contacting Dr. Davidson to see if she may be able to address or advise. The lemur of concern is Thor. He has 6 lemurs at this time. They have one cat- lynx - that is at Twin Valley. It has been identified as a native species and they cannot keep it. The cat Oliva that tested positive has been adopted out locally about 1 year ago. She was sent with her prescription of praziquantil. I advised to contact people in possession of both cats to inform them of the potential. The other domestic cat that was onsite during the 2015 investigation has died.

We wanted to update you on our request (of July 11th) to Ringtail Ranch and Rescue.

Lemurs

- There are 10 total lemurs
- We have asked for blood serology from each of the lemurs
- We informed them that they would need a veterinarian to take the samples and submit them.
- They are also aware that testing may be available in Saskatchewan, but most likely samples will have to be submitted to Europe and follow CITES protocols.
- They are concerned about costs and will be speaking to you about this

Canids and felids

- There are 3 dogs onsite, one has been recently adopted
- There is a New Guinea singing dog
- They have 3 domestic cats (the cat that tested positive in 2015 has been adopted out more than one year ago)
- There is a one year old lion onsite.
- We have asked for 3 fecal samples from each of the canids and felids.
- They have been informed that they can take the samples, but will need a submitting veterinarian
- They are aware sampling is now done in Ontario
- We are requesting that all felids and canids be treated with praziquantel (as Echinococcus is endemic in Wainfleet) until death or adopted out offsite.

Remaining animals

- We want all the remaining animals to be treated with a single dose of praziquantel
- There are ducks and chickens now onsite at Ringtail. At this time we have not requested treatment of them. Could you please verify that is appropriate?

People/contacts

- We have been provided a list of the names and contact information for family, friends, and volunteers who would have ongoing contact with the animals
- We will await animal testing for use in risk assessing human contacts.

We have requested that all costs be covered by themselves, Niagara Region Public Health will not be contributing this time. We hope you and Dr. Gardhouse have been contacted to discuss the above noted. Would you be able to confirm this?

As a note: the ill lemur- Thor- was reported to us as still being alive as of Friday, July 13th.

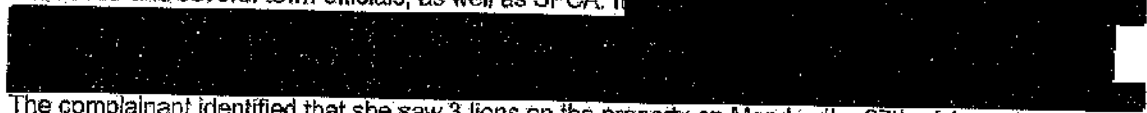

MINUTES OF THE OUTBREAK TEAM MEETING held on July 11, 2018 at 1100 hours in the EOC, 3rd Floor, Campbell East.

PRESENT: Dr. Hirji (chair), Danielle Kuusela (recorder), Angela Alfieri-Maiolo, John Burnett, Peter Jekel, Siobhan Kearns, Lorrie Ross, Carolyn Whiting

VIA TELECONFERENCE: Dr. Catherine Filejski, Chief Veterinarian of Ontario

1. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 1.1. One Lemur belonging to Ringtail Ranch and Rescue, Wainfleet, ON, has tested positive for *Echinococcus Multilocularis* (EM) infection.
- 1.2. There are two individuals residing on the property identified as Mark and Joni
- 1.3. Multiple volunteers frequenting the property. The exact number of volunteers is unknown at this time. The previous investigation involved approximately 20 volunteers and obtaining volunteer information proved problematic at the time. Given that they are no longer allowed to do public shows, it is likely that they have scaled back the number of volunteers. Therefore, obtaining volunteer information should be possible.
- 1.4. The following canids, felids, and primates currently reside on the property:
 - 1.4.1. Two domestic dogs – both recently acquired (within six months)
 - 1.4.2. One lion – on property
 - 1.4.3. Five lemurs (exact number of lemurs to be determined) – they come and go – One of the six lemurs has tested positive and the only lemur that is currently exhibiting symptoms. This lemur is palliative (95% of the liver is not functioning).
 - 1.4.4. Foxes and wolves, previously on the property, are believed to no longer be present.
- 1.5. The following animals have been adopted since the previous investigation:
 - 1.5.1. Two cats – no longer on the property. One cat has passed away. The second cat, Olivia, who tested positive previously, has been adopted out with medication
 - 1.5.2. One lynx – identified as a native species, and therefore adopted out and living in Brantford
 - 1.5.3. Two wolves – adopted out
 - 1.5.4. Spider monkeys – have been sold

2. Contact Follow-up

2.1. Animal contact follow-up

- 2.1.1. Given the circumstances, and knowing that this lemur was part of the original group of animals tested previously (tested negative), the lemur acquired EM wandering in the field or interacting with coyotes, foxes or wolves, or their droppings.
- 2.1.2. Given this reoccurrence, there is reaffirmation that there is EM in this area. As a result, the property owners need to recognize this and therefore manage their property differently to prevent this from reoccurring in the future.
- 2.1.3. Guidelines – collect info to identify risk factors. Treatment.

- 2.1.4. Given that the canids and felids will shed the parasitic eggs from feces to their fur and the animals at the facility interact, they should have fecal screening. The two dogs and one lion will submit fecal testing (three samples each) and will be tested by PCR in Ontario. The owner of the premise has been cooperative in the past, which gives reason to believe he will assist in collection. Dye will be put in the animal's food to identify the droppings. Once the testing is complete, they will be treated prophylactically with praziquantel.
- 2.1.5. The five lemurs will have serologic testing done. Specimens will be sent to Switzerland for testing given that the testing is not validated in Canada at this time. In the near future, it is anticipated that it will be available through Western College of Veterinary Medicine, University of Saskatchewan, Saskatoon. Serological screening beyond the lemurs is not recommended at this time, based on the usefulness of the information.
- 2.2. Human contact follow-up
- 2.2.1. From a Public Health perspective, how much contact do the animals have to EM and, in the second instance, interact with human contacts. How closely are the lemurs interacting with the humans?
- 2.2.1.1. The interaction is potentially significant given that the lemurs are hugging, sleeping, roaming around the home, etc.
- 2.2.2. Do we have a sense of how well the animals are confined to the property?
- 2.2.2.1. The owners have a long series of charges from the municipality pertaining to the roaming of the animals over property lines.
- 2.2.2.2. They have been issued a court order. With that, they have confined the larger animals, however, the lemurs have not been well contained.
- 2.2.2.3. An approximate four-foot high fence has been installed on the property, however given the low height animals can crawl over the fence and can utilize the trees that line the fence.
- 2.2.3. It is known to Niagara Region Public Health (NRPH) [REDACTED] Lorrie Ross, Public Health Nurse, Infectious Disease (ID) program, has spoken with him several times. [REDACTED] At this time, Dr. Hirji recommends not to follow-up with the owners or contacts.
- 2.3. Expenses
- 2.3.1. Who will cover the costs of the testing?
- 2.3.1.1. During the first investigation, NRPH paid for the testing. During this investigation, it will be the responsibility of the owners to pay for the testing.
- 2.4. Visitors to the Property
- 2.4.1. What parameters are currently in place to ensure that visitors from the public are not visiting this site?
- 2.4.1.1. Environmental Health (EH) has notified child care centres, schools, etc. in the Niagara region to avoid visiting Ringtail Ranch and the animals that reside on the property
- 2.4.1.2. John Burnett, Team Lead, EH, continuously monitors various social media sites to ensure that the animals from Ringtail Ranch are not being brought to shows, as well as ensuring members of the public are not being welcomed to the property to visit the animals

2.4.1.3. There remains an order under section 13 of the HPPA disallowing any animal's form being taken off the property, nor for the public to be allowed onto the property.

2.5. Property Maintenance

2.5.1. The owners have approximately 25 acres of land. The animals, donkeys, pigs, camels, horses, water buffalo, miniature horses, kangaroos, goats, etc., that live at Ringtail Ranch live in a barn along with various other make shift houses (i.e. shipping crates)

3. NEXT STEPS

- 3.1. EH to determine if there are any additional canids or felids aside from the two dogs and one lion residing on the property
- 3.2. EH to determine where the dogs came from
- 3.3. EH to obtain a list of volunteers/family and related information for the past six months who have had contact with animals within the last six months
- 3.4. EH (John and an additional Public Health Inspector) to review screening recommendations and coordinate sample collection for the canids and felids (owners to collect and pay) – two dogs and one lion to submit three fecal samples each for PCR testing. Once samples have been submitted, they are to be treated prophylactically with praziquantel
- 3.5. EH (John and an additional Public Health Inspector) to review screening recommendations and coordinate sample collection for serological testing of the five lemurs (owners to collect and pay) – five lemurs to submit three samples each to be tested in Switzerland
- 3.6. EH to recommend to the owner to consider long-term treatment of praziquantel for canids and felids
- 3.7. EH to coordinate a submitting Veterinarian for the lion and lemurs
- 3.8. EH to confirm that the cat who is now residing elsewhere, was treated prior to leaving Ringtail Ranch and Rescue
- 3.9. When the current order expires August 24, 2018, EH to update the order that is reissued to the owners to identify that "any animal that leaves the property will be required to have a round of praziquantel"
- 3.10. ID to update the EM fact sheets that were previously distributed to volunteers during the initial investigation in the event we receive phone calls or conduct follow-up





ORDER

Made pursuant to Section 13 of the Health Protection & Promotion Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.H.7 (the "Act")

DATE: August 13, 2018

TO: Ringtail Ranch and Rescue

WHEREAS pursuant to the Health Protection and Promotion Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.H.7, as amended (the "Act"):

1. A "health hazard" means:
 - a) a condition of a premises;
 - b) a substance, thing, plant or animal other than man; or
 - c) a solid, liquid, gas or combination of any of them that has or that is likely to have an adverse effect on the health of any person;
2. The Medical Officer of Health or Public Health Inspector may, by order, require any person to take, or refrain from taking, any specified action with respect to a health hazard. Such an order may include a requirement to do specified work, on or about premises specified in the order, and may include a requirement to destroy things specified in the order;
3. Any person who fails to obey an order made under this Act is guilty of an offence and is liable on conviction to a fine as outlined below; and
4. Every board of health is required to ensure the provision of health programs and services including the prevention or elimination of health hazards and the control of infectious and reportable diseases.

AND WHEREAS pursuant to section 474.21 of the *Municipal Act*, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, the Regional Municipality of Niagara ("Niagara Region") has all the powers, rights and duties of a board of health under the *Health Protection & Promotion Act*;

I, John Burnett, Public Health Inspector for the Niagara Region hereby order you immediately and in any case no later than August 13, 2018:

1. To prevent any public access that involves contact with animals at Ringtail Ranch and Rescue located at the property municipally known as 21180 Garringer Road, Wainfleet, Ontario.
 - This restriction is to prevent any person from having contact with the animals unless contact is necessary for the care and safety of the animals; a maximum of 10 individuals (an established volunteer base) will be allowed to assist the

owners. This restricted access shall include all and any offsite interactions between people and animals housed at Ringtail Ranch and Rescue. Such activities include but are not limited to birthday parties, home visits, fairs, other group activities, school/daycare visits and seniors' home visits.

- This restriction allows entry only to trained and vaccinated (against rabies) personnel (to a maximum of 10) provided with proper protective equipment for the regular up-keep of the area, care and safety of the animals, and/or the follow-up of any public health investigation.
2. To continue the restrictions in item 1 until:
 - a. All animals other than domestic dogs or cats are to be housed in facilities that are approved in writing by Canadian Aquarium and Zoos Association (CAZA – or similar recognized party) through their zoo accreditation program.
 - b. All humans and animal interactions for both onsite and offsite settings, meet Canadian Aquarium and Zoos Association protocols (or similar recognized party), and Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry standards.
 - c. Written documentation of accreditation by the Canadian Aquarium and Zoos Association (or similar recognized party) is provided to Niagara Region Public Health.
 - d. This office has reviewed all compliance actions and a determination has been made by this office that compliance has been achieved.

THE REASONS FOR THIS ORDER ARE THAT:

1. There have been numerous biting or scratching injuries. Niagara Region Public Health has investigated 17 animal biting and scratching incidents since 2013, 11 of which involved primates and carnivorous wild animals. Listed are the dates and species involved in those biting incidents:
 - a. September 9, 2013 - Marmoset
 - b. January 7, 2014 - Coatimundi
 - c. August 9, 2014 - Arctic Fox
 - d. August 11, 2014 - Arctic Fox
 - e. August 14, 2014 - Squirrel monkey
 - f. April 3, 2015 - Monkey sp (named Lewis)
 - g. September 18, 2015 - Spider monkey
 - h. October 13, 2015 - Squirrel monkey
 - i. October 15, 2015 - Snow monkey
 - j. April, 2016 -- Marmoset
 - k. June 11, 2016 - Donkey
 - l. June 12, 2016 - Lynx
 - m. June 12, 2016 - Squirrel monkey
 - n. July 30, 2017 -- Lion
 - o. August 12, 2017 - Coatmundi
 - p. January 8, 2018 – Lemur
 - q. June 29, 2018 – Donkey
2. Wild animals, including wild carnivores, and predators are free on the property and interact with guests/visitors without properly established enclosures to confine or control the animals from interaction with visitors to the facility. As a result there is an ongoing high degree of risk that these animals will bite and scratch visitors and those in contact with them.
3. Rabies and other infections can be transmitted from the bite or scratch of an infected animal.

4. Rabies is a near universally fatal and incurable infection in humans unless preventative treatment is provided soon after the bite or scratch.
5. Rabies is present in the wildlife population of Niagara and other areas of southern Ontario, which in the unconfined state of the animals at Ringtail Ranch and Rescue increases the likelihood of potential rabies transmission from the wildlife population to the animals at Ringtail Ranch and Rescue.
6. There are no vaccines that are licensed for use in many of the animals housed at Ringtail Ranch and Rescue.
7. The exotic nature of the animals makes them likely carriers of other infections which local medical practitioners and veterinarians are unfamiliar, and therefore unlikely to diagnose and treat.
8. Human interaction with wild and exotic animals requires controls and restrictions, so as to reduce and manage the risk of disease and injury.

Therefore, I am of the opinion on reasonable and probable grounds that:

1. A health hazard exists in the health unit served by me; and
2. The requirements specified in this order are necessary to decrease or eliminate the health hazard.

Please note that failure to comply with this Order may render you liable to penalties and costs as provided under the Act.


NOTICE

TAKE NOTICE THAT, pursuant to section 44 of the Act, you are entitled to a hearing by the Health Services Appeal and Review Board if you deliver to me and to the Health Services Review Board, Health Boards Secretariat, 151 Bloor Street West, 9th floor, Toronto, Ontario, M5S 2T5, notice in writing, requesting a hearing within fifteen (15) days after service of this Order.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE THAT although a hearing may be requested, this Order takes effect when it is served to you.

FAILURE to comply with this Order is an offence for which you may be liable, on conviction, to a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 (for a person) or \$25,000.00 (for a corporation) for every day or part of each day on which the offence occurs or continues.

Please note that notwithstanding your appeal of this Order, this Order is effective from the date specified herein until such time as the Board revokes or varies the Order or until I withdraw the Order. In accordance with section 13(5) of the Act, a copy of this Order will be delivered to the owner of the Premises.

- This restriction allows entry only to trained and vaccinated (against rabies) personnel (to a maximum of 10) provided with proper protective equipment for the regular up-keep of the area, care and safety of the animals, and/or the follow-up of any public health investigation.
2. To continue the restrictions in item 1 until:
 - a. All animals other than domestic dogs or cats are to be housed in facilities that are approved in writing by Canadian Aquarium and Zoos Association (CAZA – or similar recognized party) through their zoo accreditation program.
 - b. All humans and animal interactions for both onsite and offsite settings, meet Canadian Aquarium and Zoos Association protocols (or similar recognized party), and Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry standards.
 - c. Written documentation of accreditation by the Canadian Aquarium and Zoos Association (or similar recognized party) is provided to Niagara Region Public Health.
 - d. This office has reviewed all compliance actions and a determination has been made by this office that compliance has been achieved.

THE REASONS FOR THIS ORDER ARE THAT:

1. There have been numerous biting or scratching injuries. Niagara Region Public Health has investigated 17 animal biting and scratching incidents since 2013, 11 of which involved primates and carnivorous wild animals. Listed are the dates and species involved in those biting incidents:
 - a. September 9, 2013 - Marmoset
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2. Wild animals, including wild carnivores, and predators are free on the property and interact with guests/visitors without properly established enclosures to confine or control the animals from interaction with visitors to the facility. As a result there is an ongoing high degree of risk that these animals will bite and scratch visitors and those in contact with them.

3. Rabies and other infections can be transmitted from the bite or scratch of an infected animal.
4. Rabies is a near universally fatal and incurable infection in humans unless preventative treatment is provided soon after the bite or scratch.
5. Rabies is present in the wildlife population of Niagara and other areas of southern Ontario, which in the unconfined state of the animals at Ringtail Ranch and Rescue increases the likelihood of potential rabies transmission from the wildlife population to the animals at Ringtail Ranch and Rescue.
